It's so easy and temping to compare ourselves and our life with others'. It can be discouraging when we think we aren't "doing" enough or moving fast enough or are gifted enough like someone else. We can't live our lives looking around and asking God, "What about him? What about her?" We can only ask, "What about me? What are you asking of me, Lord?"

And in His graciousness and patience, He makes us the best version of ourselves, not the best version of another person or the best
